The brightfull models in the My First Matchbox range, 1989-1994.

Since 1970 "Matchbox Toys" have diversified into many different ranges of toys and diecast toys. The basis for this is that should a major competitor bring out a new idea which threatens the sales of any particular range, there would be many other ranges to soften the blow. In the late eighties there have been many innovations in the 1-75 series alone. These have included Laser Wheels, Colour Changes, Team Convoy sets, World Class, Motorcity and the GT range. In 1988 Matchbox achieved a growth rate of 20%. This was mainly due to growth in diecast vehicles and Pre-School business.

In 1989 the company took a positive step forwards increasing the sales of Pre-School items. The whole Pre-School line was relaunched with new packaging at the centre of which was the Activity Bear. The sales figures were staggering for the sales of this range went up by a massive 71%. In order to facilitate this rate of progress Matchbox became involved in 'extensive new product development'. At the heart of the compaign was a 'fun series of Matchbox Miniatures' developed especially for younger children. Brightly coloured models were 'designed to give hours of imainative play and educational fun'

The 1989 Trade Catalogue showed three LL sets (LL-103 Railway, LL-102 Town and LL-101 Farm) under the heading 'Toddler Toys'. These were sets with plastic 'Playtracks'. The major interest to 1-75 collectors was the appearance of a Volkswagen Ambulance (MB20e) in a new livery showing a bandaged teddy, and a Ford Transit (MB60g) showing a teddy with cakes, both in the LL-102 Town set.

In addition to the Ambulance and Transit designated to the models from the LL-102 Town Set, in Volume 5 No. 1 of MICA of april 1989, Paul Carr revealed a Volvo Tilt (MB26f) in yellow with a yellow canopy bearing the Matchbox logo and a teddy bear.







Sadly these three models were not released. The only place where the three elusive first three models could have been seen at the time was in the Matchbox Room at the Chester Toy Museum. All the three models do have Macau cast baseplates, and did not yet feature the colorfull wheels. I maneged to find the Volvo Tilt Truck for my collection as Paul Carr had this for sale some years ago.

The Ford Transit (MB60g) was sold by him also but that model went to another collector.

In the following months a number of collectors were disappointed when, after opening the large 'My First Playtrack' sets, only standard models from the 1-75 range were found.



In Volume 5 No. 1 of MICA of april 1989, Paul Carr also revealed that there were to be three Triple Packs without track. The three packs, known as 'My First Playsets', quickly appeared and there was considerable competition between collectors and parents to purchase these models. One local Tesco store reported that its shelves were cleared within one day of displaying these three triple packs. The interest in this range appeared to be phenomenal for the appeal was certainly not limited to the under fives.







The Leyland Titan Bus, featuring the 'My First Matchbox' logo with the Germany spelling of 'Nurnberg' 1990 on the roof, was the model chosen to be given away at the Nuremberg Toy Fair. Perhaps this served to show the importance of the range with potential trade buyers.



Indeed, the 1990 Trade Catalogue revealed that the miniature 'My First Matchbox' model would now number 24 and the name of the series had been changed from 'My First Playset'. There was no sign of the three models from the 'My First Playtracks'.

The 1990 trade catalogue showed 3 sets with different artwork showing My First Matchbox models and only a few standard models:



LL-101 My First Playtrack Farm

LL-102 My First Playtrack Town (no picture)

The LL-105 My First Playtrack Superset set with 83 pieces! but only 2 models. (the 0-6-0 Steam Loco (MB43c) and Passenger Coach (MB44c)) The set has a similar box design and was not pictured in the tradecatalogue.

Collectors with sharp eyes studied the various Playtracks and wondered wheter there would be a Tractor and Trailer, GMC Wrecker and Reynolds Crane Truck An enlarged design on the Bulldozer with simulated rocks on the blade instead of diagonal lines.









In Volume 5, No.6 of MICA of february 1990, Paul showed six more of the new models, including the Horse Box (MB40b), School Bus (MB47e) and Uitlity Truck (MB33g) which were not shown in the 1990 catalogue. Paul suggested that there would be 23 models in the range and three models not previously shown anywhere would be a new version of the Volvo Tilt Truck (MB26f) the Passenger Coach (MB44c) and Combine Harvester (MB51c) Eighteen would been due to release in Germany at the time and fifteen of these were available for the UK. In february 1990 it was not yet known if the range was going to be released in

The China based sets began to appear and by July 1990 the first variation was recorded. Whereas the original Fire Engine (MB18c) had a yellow ladder with a blue base. With the imminent demise in terms of production in Macau, this could prove to be a short lived variation. The 0-6-0 Steam Loco (MB43c), Passenger Coach (MB44c) and Peugeot Quasar (MB49e) were the first My First Matchbox models which were changed from Macau to China bases.

One of the main changes was to the 0-6-0 Steam Loco (MB43c) which underwent a complete redesign. A few of the yellow and lime 0-6-0 Steam Locos appeared in the last Macau sets. (pictures from www.garyscars.co.uk)

Several 6 packs of models appeared over the life of the range, some were exclusives for certain stores, the pack which contained the Lincoln Town Car (MB43g) was the only source for this model in the UK. Other packs then the 5 pictured may exist as they were made with Macau, China and Thailand boxes.












In 1990 several packs have been manufactured for the USA in the 'Pre-School' three packs. These only contain China-based models and are essentially the same models as those found in Britain. Two diffrences relate to the stricter laws in the US whereby it is thought that the plastic top on the Volvo Tilt (MB26f) and the arms and buckets on the Utility Truck may be swallowed by very young children and so they have not been fitted. The only variation noted in the US involves the colour of the pivot for the arms of the Utility Truck. These may be either blue or yellow plastic. The yellow plastic versions have not been seen for sale in Britain.









Also in 1990 at least 2 sets with different artwork comparing to the sets released in the UK were released in the USA. The artwork does show My First Matchbox models but like the 3-packs they were marked as Matchbox 'PreSchool' sets. I do not know if a Railwayset was made and can only show the Farmset and Townset. Confirmation of the Railwayset, if exist, is required. The sets contain China-based models.

After that the first models from Thailand have filtered through, there are many variations for the keen collector. The Bulldozer mentioned above has appeared in the different livery shown in the catalogue and several models have seen a change in the colour of hubs.

In Volume 7 No. 1 of MICA of april 1991, Paul Carr revealed six more models due for 1991, all with a Thailand base. From left to right upper row:

Lincoln Town Car (MB43g), Ford Sierra (MB15d) and Ford LTD Police Car (MB16e) These are now very difficult to find and the rarest My First Matchbox models. From left to right lower row: Flareside pickup (MB53d), Ford Bronco (MB39e) and Porsche 935 (MB55f)



These six models were pictured in the 1991 and 1992 trade catalogues although the Ford Bronco (MB39e) in the catalogue had yellow wheels with red hubs while the MICA photo showed a model with yellow wheels and blue hubs.

The 1991 trade catalogue revealed 5 sets of which LL-101, LL-102 and LL-103 were the same as in 1990:

The 1992 trade catalogue only revealed the 1st four sets of the above lisiting.

In Volume 7 No. 6 of MICA of february 1992 Paul revealed that the Porsche 935 (MB55f) was not going to be released. This was to be the end for the small models in The MY FIRST MATCHBOX range and no more new models were introduced. The last year these models were available was 1994. The last models produced had one colour hubs (possibly as an economy measure)

The Taxi with all red hubs is very hard to find as it was only available in an 1993 ARGOS gift set (nbr. 62117.21) This set contains China-based models. All 10 models in the ARGOS set were sealed in baggies.

In 1994 a totally different design was made for the My First Matchbox range, the boxes more white in color. This change of design sounds strange as no new models were introduced since 1992.

So far I only found 6 different models in a single pack (all numbered 62111.21. All boxes were made in China and had the Mt Laurel U.S.A. address printed on them. Generally this type of packaging is more difficult to find. See also the variation listing at the end of this article for the model variations I found in these later boxes.

I also found a 3-pack with a similar blue/white design. A very rare pack and I would like to hear from you if you have found this also, maybe with different contents. The pack is numbered 62113.21 and also made in China with the Mt Laurel U.S.A. address.

This range provides an interesting theme for collectors and I am sure that I am not alone. I started to collect them in the early nineties as I like the toys value of them and the fact they are unique in their kind, because of being so brightfull. That collection was sold in 1996 when I moved house to my current place. In 2004 I started to build a new collection of these again. Since then I managed to collect almost every variation known. I'am still missing a few giftsets, particularly the 'LL230 My First Matchbox Playtrack Garage' (box shows the German text; Meine Erste Spielstrasse Parkhaus) and the 'LL250 Fold-n-Play Farm'. The following 2 pictures on the left came from Chinese Ebay, many years ago. The seller didn't want to sent to Europe. I never saw these sets again untill october 2015 when I bought the german version of the LL250 Klappset Bauernhof as pictured on the right.

Around spring 1992 two Superking sports cars (K-8-E Ferrari F-40 and the SP-13/14-A Porsche 959) and the K-15-B The Londoner in MY FIRST MATCHBOX range has been released in the UK and that was the end of this range of colourful models for pre-school aged children, and us older kids.

A photo of the K-15-B The Londoner in MY FIRST MATCHBOX colors for the Save the Children was shown in Volume 9 No.2 of MICA of august 1993. The bus features the Matchbox logo on the front panel of the upper deck and for each bus sold Matchbox donated 20 pence to the charity "Save the Children" fund.
